**REMEMBERING OUR
 FALLEN FIRE FIGHTERS**

In the month of July we acknowledge the anniversary's of eight Fire Fighters who died in the line of duty. All eight of the deaths were caused by driving accidents. In 1929 three Fire Fighters died together in a train verses pumper accident. Two, in 1953 perished when their pumper from Fire Station 8 collided with the ladder truck from Central Station. Molly Walker's pumper that he was driving was hit by a city bus, Ciff Weise's supply wagon was hit by a work train and the ladder truck Harry Dodd was riding hit a passenger car and a streetcar.

Houston has had five line of duty losses where more than one Fire Fighter died. July of 1929, three Fire Fighters and December 1929 two Fire Fighters perished. July 1953 two Fire Fighters, November 1959 two Fire Fighters; and in February of 2000, Kim Smith and Lewis Mayo.

From the July list there is some interesting facts about three of the Fire Fighters. Molly Walker, who was in the Department from 1914 to 1940, drove horse drawn Steamer 3, which was housed at Station 3. In the early 1920's he was one of the first to drive a motorized apparatus. The second Fire Fighter is Captain John S. Little, Sr., his son was John S. Little, Jr., who was Houston's Fire Chief from 1974 to 1976. The third Fire Fighter is Joseph Solito, who was Local 341's Union President in 1949.
