As most know, I always welcome anyone who has words to say about a loved one. I feel that this column is a great place for someone to tell us about a loved one who is no longer with us. This month I am proud to share my column with Ryan Johnson who is a nephew of brother Fire Fighter Jay Jahnke. Jay died in the line-of-duty on October 13, 2001. Ryan was able to encourage other relatives to submit as well, however, I did not have enough space for them all, so I will continue this article next month. Right here is where I introduce my guest but as you can see below Ryan has done a great job of that himself.

To my brother and sister firefighters and friends:

First, I would like to introduce myself. My name is Ryan Johnson, and I have been with HFD for 11 years. My rank is Engineer/Operator/EMT currenlly assigned to Ambulance 38 on the A Shift. My grandfather was District Chief Claude Jahnke, and my Grandmother is Kay Jahnke, as some of you may know her. My father is retired Captain Rod Johnson (57/A). My mother Karen Jahnke Johnson is Captain Jay Jahnke's oldest sister. She is the oldest of four and Jay is the youngest.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of Jay's family to once again thank everyone who has done so much for us. Thank you, Scott, for all that you have done to keep Jay's memory alive. You have told me more than once that Jay was like a brother to you, and I know he meant a lot to you. We would also like to thank the people who organized the many fundraisers for Dawn, Jayne, and Hunter. The Houston Fire Department Union Local 341 also deserves a great deal of thanks for taking care of virtually anything that was needed. A heart felt thank you to the Cy-Creek Volunteer Fire Department and Station 22, where Jay was a safety officer, for your fundraising and memorial ceremony. Thank you Fire Station 2 for holding the annual memorial gathering to remember Jay every year on each anniversary of his death. A special thanks to Troy Blakeney for providing his private jet to fly my first cousin Kenny into town from his military post so he could make it on time to the funeral for Jay. There were so many other things that were done that we were so thankful for. Thank you with all our hearts.

For as far back as I can remember, Jay has always loved the fire department. When I was a kid, we used to go to the fire muster downtown, and Jay was always getting into some kind of competition like the bucket brigade race. Sometimes he would take my older brother and I places, and we would stop by a fire station so he could show us the fire trucks.

When I got a little older, we would sometimes go to a fire scene that he had picked up on his scanner. I always thought it was so cool to get to go by the police cars and drive up by the fire trucks. He would say, "Just stay with me!" We would walk around and talk to people. I had no idea what they were talking about, and was too amazed by the fire and lights to listen.



Jay was so excited when I decided to become a Fire Fighter. He helped to guide me throughout my career. Jay told me to try and take every class the department offered like he did. I don't know how he accomplished all the things he did: father, Fire Fighter, instructor, side jobs, extra HFD classes, and too many more to list. I can only seem to do about three of those.

I remember when Jay, myself, and my friend Mike (now brother-in-law) went to the HFD Barbecue Cook-off in Memorial Park. Jay met us there. He had that silly-playful look on his face and said, "You guys thirsty? Want a beer?" His face lit up even more when we said yes. He replied, "Hope your really thirsty!" as he handed us each the biggest beer cans we had ever seen. These cans were almost as big as the mini kegs they sell in the grocery stores. They were called "ELEPHANT BEER", and we had to hold them with two hands. I met a lot of Fire Fighters that day with Jay, and we had some great laughs showing off that particularly strong beer.

Jay knew just about everybody. I used to have a great time with him at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Championship Barbecue Cook off. Jay was on the Safety Committee, and he could get us into any booth we wanted.

I was at the Four Leaf Towers fire where my Uncle Jay collided with fate. Those are the worst memories of my life. When they got Jay out of the building, I tried to make my way to him. The reality of the situation hit me when I saw from a distance his best friend Brad Stewart, and others, by his side attempting to revive him. Then all of my strength left me, and I collapsed. I am thankful that big Captain Rick Collins was there for me.

I think about Jay all of the time, especially on the mornings when I am driving to work. He has taught me to appreciate every moment of life. I know he is still with me, guiding me, until one day when we meet again and he says, "Just stay with me!" and he leads me to meet the Lord and all his new friends. I'm sure I'll be "amazed" beyond all belief.
